


Club Fishing Boundaries

I published these maps in the April 2023 newsletter, but I think it's still good to be reminded of where we can and can't fish as a club. Mainly for the benefit of new members, but also for anyone who is not too sure. These maps can also be found on the club website under Fishing Info, and in the constitution.



Inshore Boundaries

The inshore boundaries (marked in yellow) encompass the Pumicestone Passage and extend south from the northern tip of Bribie Island to Skirmish point, eastward to the red lateral marker on the western side of Gilligan's, south to the green marker then on to the yellow cardinal beacon, west to the red lateral marker in Deception Bay and then north to an extended line along both green zone markers to Godwin beach as detailed on the map.



Offshore Boundaries

The Offshore fishing boundaries are limited to the north by 26.22.000 and to the south by 27.30.555 and exclude all areas within the Inshore fishing boundaries.

Freshwater Competition Boundaries

The monthly freshwater competition is restricted to the following impoundments – Somerset Dam, Wivenhoe Dam, Moogerah Dam, Maroon Dam, Bjelke Petersen Dam, Boondooma Dam, Borumba Dam, Monduran Dam and Cressbrook Dam.

You must have a current permit to fish these dams.

Closed Seasons

Please be aware of the following closed seasons


Spanish Mackerel: The Southern Spanish Mackerel closed seasons are 1st to 21st February and again from 1st to 21st March. These dates apply each year to the Southern east coast waters south of latitude 22°S (Slightly south of Mackay) down to the QLD/NSW border.

Monthly Fishing Prizes

Because of the present state of the club finances, the committee has decided to increase the monthly fishing prizes, effective from the January 2024 weigh-ins.

By the way, did I mention I outfished the boys that day?




Giant Sawfish caught in WA.
