On a brighter note, Xmas in July will soon be on us, and we are still calling for member numbers so get your names in. Our Catering /Social Guru has submitted his upcoming report that will be in this newsletter.

Welcome to any new members reading this for the first time and we hope to see a lot more of you at either our General meetings, BBQs, or Soup Day in August, or of course on the water doing what we try to do best.



### **Evan's Head**

### **June 2023**

I recently wrote a short story about a fishing trip I made to Evan's Head with a close friend of our family and since then I have had the opportunity to revisit this special laidback township for another trip, hence this tale of an epic week's fishing adventure.

We have, for the last 10 years or more, travelled to this quaint northern rivers township to avail our club members of some great social activities and of course the fishing adventures.

Organised by Ron Winnett and John Casey as an offshoot to our August/ September trips due also to our long COVID shutdown, this trip is in early Winter when the big Snapper and Pearl Perch are Predominant. We travel down leisurely leaving around 9.00am to have an early lunch at the restful, riverside township of Chinderah, and then on to Evan's Head to book into our rental property for a weeklong adventure. This is all setup by our charter company Evan's Head Fishing Charters with their boat being a 42-foot Steber Craft with a Cummins Diesel motor. "Pirate", as it's named, is skippered by long-time friend Simon Gill (no pun intended) and on reflection I have crossed the bar over 30 times with him and I never give it a second thought.

Ok, so we are in and have settled into our rooms, set up the kitchen, had a relaxing coldie, and are now talking about the Bowlo for dinner which is around the corner from our lodgings. Sunday is a relaxing day where we just hang around or fish the local areas including the rear of the boat when it arrives back if they have one booked. There are a couple of very large bream that live in the rocks which, having been caught a few times, many are far too wise and quick for us. This also gives us a rough idea of what's happening fish-wise, whether in

close, 10 km out, or out wide 40 km. We tend to always fish wide for the better class of fish although this is an additional hour's steam out to what we call Bribie Reef.

The skipper has set us up for a 5.45 am start, so that means we are up around 4.45am, I won't mention names but some people just can't stay in bed any longer than 4.00 am. A quick breakfast, pack the couple of cars, and down to the boat. Our Bribie Reef didn't produce as we have previously encountered but still managed 35 and 36 fish for the first two days. Wind was expected for the next day, so it was a unanimous decision to have that day off to give us time to recoup and to give the skipper a well-earned rest as this was his 3rd week straight.

Our last day out, and to our surprise the owner Mic Mcgilvary was to be our skipper and straight off, his decision to travel north to grounds he reckoned to be untouched due to recent weather conditions,

should pay dividends. Into our first couple of drops to 90 or more metres and the fish were leaping into the boat. No major large snapper but some great Pearl Perch up around 3.5 kg and a couple of Samson fish around 7.5 kg made the morning. It is never boring as I managed to hookup a large Cuttlefish the charter before weighing a guestamated 15kgs or more. We released this gigantor back to the deep alive but not before he sprayed his black ink over the back deck of the boat. Our day's tally was 66 to bring our total to around 137

fish keeping up our normal take home catch. Over the course of my charters to these excellent fishing grounds I have not noticed any significant change to fish stocks, possibly due to such a large reef area, and only now having 2

charter boats in opposition to each other here.

We later learned that I could have kept the cuttlefish as it is renowned as a delicacy, or of course a great bait.

All our catch is filleted and skinned at the local cleaning tables with the frames and a few give away fish distributed to the pelicans and a few local crabbers and older mates who hang around and offer to hose down when we finish.

Back to the Ponderosa to sort out the catch, clean and dry our own and to Cryovac set size packs for home.

Whilst the Owner's wife Katrina was sorting out the final payment with Ron, I thought it a good time to try and broker a sponsorship deal with her. She was more than happy to oblige so it was set in motion for a deal for our Xmas raffle prizes, and for us to advertise in our newsletter and Website. I hope we can support this even more when the time arises, as not only for friendships, but keeping a small business afloat during some rough times in the Northern Rivers area is important to our club members. At this point of time not only the fishermen from the Subbranch, Ron and John's week, and now 3 weeks in Aug/ Sept support this area, and I hope anyone travelling through would stop off for a while.

Our final day is normally spent maybe packing up rooms, cars, cleaning, and an attack on the Bowlo or RSL to try for a win in their raffles. A convoy style drive home with a quick coffee at Coomera and looking forward to the next chance to visit.






