Hello Everyone,



That's about it from me, just remember there is no BBQ afternoon for June or July - so the next BBQ will be held on <u>Sunday the 27th August at 3pm</u>.



Target-a-species month long competition

Inshore (Bream) & offshore (Pearl Perch) comps 26 May—23rd June

There is still plenty of time left in this competition, so make sure you get your bream and/or pearl perch registered with Richard or John before the 23rd June to be in to win.

The annual Bream and Pearl Perch month-long competition starts on the 26th May and goes to the 23rd June this year. Which means, for anyone who is not familiar with this comp, that you can only weigh in Bream in the inshore comp, and Pearl Perch in the offshore comp between these dates. You can still catch and keep any other (legal) fish, but you can't weigh them in.

Flathead Month-Long Competition

Friday 23rd June – Friday 28th July 2023

This annual comp runs from the 23rd June til the 28th July this year, and unlike the Bream/Pearl Perch comp, it runs at the same time as the normal monthly fishing comps, with its own prizes and presentation. So you can still catch and weigh other fish like you do each month.

How Well do you Know your Flathead?

Dusky Flathead

The Dusky Flathead can almost be thought of as a different species, as it has its own set of take size and possession limits, separate to all other flathead, and they are often mis-identified.

The Dusky is also more likely to be the flathead caught in our waters, although the others are definitely out there.

The pectoral fins on the Dusky are densely spotted with brown, and there is a **large dark blotch** on its tail. There are **no** yellow markings on its tail.

There is a **40cm** minimum take size, and a **75cm** max. The possession limit is 5 (which is not included in the combined limit for all other flathead).

There is a popular misconception, too, that Duskys change sex as they age. Their sex is determined at the juvenile stage, and most of the Dusky Flathead that people catch are more likely to be female, owing to the larger proportion of females to males in the sea.

It's All About the Tail



This is a Dusky Flathead. The fish, that is, the other is a Trevor.




And this is a Dusky tail. Note the dark blotch.

How Well do you Know your Flathead

Bartailed Flathead - Minimum take size 30cm




Bartail flathead have a yellow blotch in the middle of the tail (see right)

Northern Sand Flathead



Yellowtailed Flathead Tail

Yellowtail Flathead tail is whitish with 3 or 4 horizontal dark bars and a **yellow blotch along the top edge** of the tail (see right)



Northern Sand Flathead Tail

Northern Sand Flathead tail is whitish with a series of dark horizontal streaks that narrow toward the top. There are **no** dark blotches and **no** yellow patches on the tail.

Northern Sand Flathead - Minimum take size 30cm

There are many varieties of flathead, so if in doubt, check official ID charts or websites.

There is a combined possession limit of 5 for all flathead, which does not include the Dusky, they have their own possession limit, also of 5.

All QLD tidal waters - From 1st November to 15th December - Spanner Crabs

All QLD tidal waters - From 1st June to 31st August - Australian Bass

QLD East Coast - From 1st November to 31st January - Barramundi

There are also two Southern Spanish mackerel closed seasons:-

From 1st to 21st February and again from 1st to 21st March

These dates apply each year, and the east coast southern closure boundary is located south of latitude 22 degrees south.
